This is to advise that the Livermore City Council will conduct a public hearing at its meeting of July 8, 2024, beginning at 7:00 p.m. to consider the matters listed below:

- Public Hearing for the confirmation of the levy of assessments for the City's Landscape Maintenance Districts. For Fiscal Year 2024-25 for Maintenance District No. LL-2, Annexation No. 1996-7, the Fiscal Year 2024-25 assessment is equal to the Fiscal Year 2023-24 assessment. For the remainder of the Districts, the Fiscal Year 2024-25 assessments is increased from Fiscal Year 2023-24 based on the increased cost of maintenance and the permitted annual inflationary index. The Fiscal Year 2024-25 assessments are at or below the maximum allowable assessment amount for each respective District.
- Hearing to consider a request for Vesting Tentative Tract Map and Site Plan Design Review to develop vacant land located southwest of the Portola Avenue and Tranquility Circle intersection with a for-sale residential condominium project, known as Shea Aura. The development consists of three-story condominium buildings with 164 total units, including 33 units affordable to buyers with median and moderate-income levels, and 17 accessible units. The development also includes pocket parks, landscaping, trail connections, parking, and frontage improvements. The applicant has submitted for relief under the Housing Crisis Act of 2019 (CA SB330) and State Density Bonus laws (Government Code section 65915).
